THE BEAT IS STILL BLUE IN NEWPORT

Just in from the pier at Newport Beach stands one of the last remaining examples of the Beat Generation in Southern California. The affectionately named <u>Sid's Blue Beet</u> was the brain-child of <u>Sid Soffer</u>, and remains, to this day, at 107 21st Place. (1959 photo of Soffer to left)

Singer Bobby Fuller

referred to a burgeoning youth counter-culture when he unleashed his 1965 garage-punk staple "I Fought the Law," but he might as easily have been talking about Sid Soffer, who fought the law over a building code violation for the last 12 years of his life. Well, the law won. Judge Susie Shaw sought to throw ol' Sid in jail back in 1995, but Soffer instead became a self-proclaimed fugitive living in Las Vegas. That is where I first caught up with him a little less than a decade ago.
